Rage to Reason: Behavioral Intervention for the Treatment of Explosive Behavior in Children with Emotional Disorders

Rage to Reason is a new workshop for teachers, professionals, and parents who work with and support children and adolescents with Emotional Disorders who exhibit explosive behavior. This behavior often occurs when asked to follow a direction, do school work, or are told “no”. The training includes an understanding of the deficits that cause explosive behavior and teaches professionals/parents to work with students to follow directions without refusals and meltdowns; *Rage to Reason* also teaches both social and coping skills.

This workshop is designed for those children who have average to above average cognitive skills and some ability to reason and understand problem solving. These children may have a diagnosis of Bipolar, ODD, ADHD, Anxiety Disorder, OCD, Reactive Attachment Disorder (RAD), DMDD, PTSD, Autism Spectrum and other Emotional Disorders; although students may not have a diagnosis—just explosive.

Amy Buie, MEd, BCBA, LBA, has over 25 years of experience working in the field of Applied Behavior Analysis. She is the CEO of Learning Momentum, an agency specializing in the treatment of children with emotional disorders who have challenging behavior. She is also the founder and organizational consultant for The Center for Autism Education, a not-for-profit agency working with both children and adults with developmental disabilities.

Amy teaches course work at the University of Missouri-St. Louis in the field of Autism and Behavior Studies. She presents at workshops and conferences across the Midwest. She is the author of *Behavior Mapping, Teaching Appropriate Behavior to Children with Autism and Related Disorders* and *Rage to Reason*. Her area of expertise is teaching reinforcement based strategies and working children in both the school and home setting who have significantly challenging and explosive behavior due to an emotional disorder or anxiety.

Please, Tell Me... Helping Individuals with Autism Decode the World through Evidence Based Practices

Students with autism are amazing individuals, each unique and extraordinary in their own way. It can be difficult for service providers, teachers, and parents to help these students navigate the school community and the social world. By understanding their common struggles and characteristics of thinking we can start to help these students unravel social mysteries and make more positive connections with peers and others. This, in turn, will help their quality of life both now and in their future endeavours.

This day-long seminar will teach participants the basic characteristics of thinking of someone with autism and then couple that with Evidence Based Practices in the field of autism. Through activities, discussion, and interactive lectures, each participant will leave with hands-on lessons and ideas that can be immediately implemented into their settings. This seminar is appropriate for a variety of grades and severity levels and includes copies of sample lesson plans.

Jennifer M. Schmidt has spent 22 years in the field of education as a general teacher, autism consultant, and a special educator. In addition to teaching at a high school, Jennifer is also an instructor at Wright State University and Antioch McGregor Midwest, both in Dayton, Ohio.

Jennifer is an experienced presenter at national and international conferences and recently published her first book, *Why Didn't They Just Say That? PEERspective – A Complete Curriculum*, about an innovative model used to teach social skills to students with mild autism through peer modeling and other evidence-based practices. Jennifer earned her Bachelor's degree in Elementary Education and a Master's degree in Special Education mild-intensive from Wright State University.
